Issues with Immigration

As most of us know, the situation for immigrants wishing to come to the United States is very difficult. We work in connection with 10 or more other organizations and shelters in El Paso and New Mexico and resources are being stretched. Recently over 950 people have been released by authorities each day. Local organization help most of them to arrange transportation and be on their way to their sponsors or families in a day or two.

However, many others are arriving after a terrible trek through the jungle in Panama, where bodies of those who have died are lying along side the path. Our hope is to provide comfort and consolation in the time of sadness leaving their homeland and spending two months or more trying to get to the United States.

Holy Cross continues to offer hospitality when we have space, though that is less frequent in the fall because it is a popular time for retreats. Please try to keep informed about the justice issues and the immediate need for compassion.

Laudato Si Table at the Franciscan Art Festival at Holy Cross September 4-5, 2022

The Laudato Si! Steering Committee at Holy Cross Friary was very much present at the Franciscan Art Festival at Holy Cross Retreat Center in Mesilla, N.M. The table had been strategically placed near the entrance of the Festival by Fr. Tom Smith OFM Conv. We were able to speak with at least a thousand people about the Laudato Si! goals at the Festival.

The table was staffed by members of the Holy Cross Laudato Si! Steering Committee, secular Franciscans, and several regular Holy Cross Retreat Center volunteers.

Debbie Isham, who is a member of the Laudato Si! Steering Committee had designed two very attractive cards for us to hand out to people. One of the cards had a photo of the new Franciscan mural at Holy Cross on one side and the Laudato S! Goals on the other side. The other card had a drawing of St. Francis on one side and an abridged version of the Canticle of the Creatures on the other side. We believe that hundreds of people saw the Laudato Si! goals for the first time.
