Immigration Update

We have been welcoming immigrants who need longer stays at times. Some were unprocessed, and others have more complications than can be resolved in two or three days. In one case, the immigrants were assisted by both retreatants and our staff, after singing the Posada song, "En el nombre del Cielo hemos pido posada." Others have stayed for longer times to get their status updated or to earn money for travel. It is a challenge at times but a real service to those who have struggled so much to find a safer place to live.
